

# **BASKETBALL** COURTSIDING POLICY - QUICK FACTS

The Courtsiding Policy outlines Basketball Australia's position on Courtsiding at Australian Basketball Venues. There is no legitimate purpose for a courtsiding to be present at any Australian basketball venue

#### The term 'Courtsiding' means;

 The capture, recording and/or transmission of match data, match-related data or match vision at or in relation to any Competition or Event without the express written authorization of Basketball Australia

# • The responsibilities of Basketball Australia under this policy include;

- Managing the implementation of this courtsiding policy
- Providing advice and guidance to competitions and events in connection with this policy
- Centrally monitoring instances of courtsiding across Australia and reduce instances of courtsiding
- Provide resources and guidance to competitions to assist with the implementation of this policy

# The responsibilities of Competitions, Events and Venues include;

- Ensuring courtsiding is prohibited under the terms of entry
- o Display posters and messaging at the venue that state it is prohibited
- Monitor the venue for any person who might be engaging in courtsiding
- Evict and record personal details of any person suspected of courtsiding
- o Immediately report instances of courtsiding to the Basketball Australia Integrity Unit

#### Courtsiders are not entitled to Media Accreditations

 Any persons with a media accreditation suspected of courtsiding shall not be entitled to a media accreditation and will have their accreditation revoked
